From 2010 and 2017 Paul co-hosted TEDxBrisbane, at the State Library of Queensland and The Brisbane Powerhouse . The conferences brought together the most creative and critical thinkers Brisbane and Queensland had to offer, and through the TED network offered the opportunity to spread their ideas to a world stage.

In 2006 Paul was Awards Jury Director for the RAIA Queensland Awards.
